CLUBS: Clubs are student-based school organizations. We encourage students to be involved in clubs. Clubs must have the following operating documents approved and on file with our Associated Student Body (ASB) office:

1. Application for Student Club
2. Constitution/Bylaws
3. Proposed Budget (when applicable)

All clubs and organizations must have a current Upper Lake High School teacher as an advisor. All advertising or promotion for clubs and organizations at Upper Lake High School must be pre-approved by the ASB Office.

Starting your own club is a great way to meet new people and spend time doing something you enjoy. You'll also get leadership experience that can help build your skills, strengthen your resume and support college applications.

Any activity (during school or after school) needs to be pre-approved using the following process:

1. Advisor submits activity request through the KissFlow process
2. Principal/ASB Advisor reviews and approves request
3. Activity goes on master school calendar
4. Activity goes on daily bulletin
